Aspergillus spp, Stachybotrys atra, Penicillium spp, and Cladosporium

Dear Sirs:

I would like to thank you and your company for the environmental program you provided to service our base housing needs. Ten months have passed since initial Bio-Science treatment eliminated the original contamination, including *Aspergillus spp, Stachybotrys atra, Penicillium spp, and Cladosporium*. Subsequent independent inspections indicate no new growth as of this time in the 50 thrasher Hall rooms that were treated with TM-100. Similar results have been observed at Scorpion Hall, which is also free from new growth micotoxins ten months beyond treatment. Your science has been validated by the follow-up tests analyzed by a certified independent laboratory.

Our Base hygiene office first disclosed the presence of high levels of micotoxins at Thresher Hall as far back as April 11, 2000, with contamination migrating from the second floor hallway to rooms on the third and forth floors as well. We tried numerous applications of bleach (10%) and various other methods suggested by EPA. But were not able to solve our problem on our own. When the situation eventually compelled the Navy to place the 50 rooms offline, outsourcing became a last resort. It was at that point that a decision was made to try Bio-Science, with its proprietary, organic, enzyme-based treatment program. On September 3, 2001, Bio-Science initiated its remediation process.
